Federal Lands Highway (FLH)

- FLH is an office within the FHWA
- 3 Division Offices
 - Eastern, Central, Western
- Deliver projects that access
 - National Parks
 - National Forests System Lands
 - National Wildlife Refuges
 - BLM Lands
 - US Corp of Engineers Lands
 - Tribal Lands

FAST Act Overview

- Fixing America's Surface Transportation
- Program authorized through 2020
- Requires minimum 4 year program of projects
- Includes Federal Lands Highway Program
- Funds allocated annually


What is the <u>Federal Lands Access</u> <u>Program (FLAP)?</u>

- "Access Program" goals
 - Improve transportation facilities that provide access to, are adjacent to, or are located within Federal lands.
 - Supplements State and local resources for public roads, transit systems, and other transportation facilities
 - With an emphasis on high-use Federal recreation sites and Federal economic generators.




Federal Lands Access Program

Federal Lands Access Program

- Where can FLAP funds be spent?
 - On a Federal Lands Access Transportation Facility
 - > public <u>highway</u>, <u>road</u>, <u>bridge</u>, <u>trail</u> or <u>transit system</u>
 - > located on, is adjacent to, or provides access to Federal lands
 - ➤ title or maintenance responsibility is vested with State, County, Local Government, or Tribe
 - Vested- bears majority of the cost











Federal Lands Access Program (con't)

- This is a transportation program, this is not a "grant" program.
- Federal Highway Administration, Western Federal Lands has stewardship and oversight responsibility of <u>ALL</u> projects
- The emphasis is on access to Federal Lands thus, the name Federal Lands Access Program
- Proposals are jointly submitted by local agency and FLMA.

Where can funding be spent?








Federal Lands and Indian Reservations



Federal Lands and Indian Reservations





Federal Lands Access Program Project Programmed (con't)



ID Ketchum-Challis Highway

- Rockfall mitigation and roadway improvement on ID 75 from MP 206.90 to 208.10
- Total FLAP amount \$7,898,816
- Amount of match funding provided by IDT: \$582,338



ID Lakeshore Drive

- Reconstruct 0.4
 miles of Lakeshore
 Drive from Caddy
 Lane to Duffers Lane
 in the City of
 Cascade, ID
- Total FLAP amount \$1,836,649
- Amount of match funding provided: \$138,136



- OR Skyliners Road Improvements
- Rehabilitate road accessing the forest, leading to popular recreation sites including a Sno-Park and mountain bike trailhead
- Total FLAP amount \$8,300,000
- Amount of match funding provided: \$1,020,000



OR Tiller Trail Highway

- Realign curves, rehabilitate pavement, and improve drainage
- Total FLAP amount: \$4,486,500
- Amount of match funding provided: \$513,500



WA Cattle Point Road Relocation

- Relocate the road away from the eroding bluff and install new guard rail
- Total FLAP amount requested: \$3,712,145
- Amount of match funding provided: \$743,375



WA Eagle Creek Road Phase 1

- 2.5 mile full depth pavement reconstruction, and cross culvert replacement
- Total FLAP amount \$402,808
- Amount of match funding provided: \$62,865
- Other funds: \$687,134



Programming Decisions Committee (PDC)

- Who makes programming decisions?
 - The Programming Decisions Committee
 - Members include representatives from:
 - Federal Highway Administration
 - Western Federal Lands Highway Division
 - State Department of Transportation
 - Local Government representative
 - Local Highway Technical Assistance Council (ID)
 - Association of Oregon Counties (OR)
 - County Road Administration Board (WA)

Technical Advisory Group (TAG)

- Who evaluates proposals?
 - A Technical Advisory Group (TAG) is made up of several entities to help evaluate proposals that includes:
 - > WFL
 - State Department of Transportation
 - > Local Government representative
 - > FLMA representatives from:
 - NPS, USFS, USACE, BLM, DOD, and USFWS

Investment Strategy

- Maximize the use of limited funds annually by emphasizing :
 - Proposals that access high-use Federal recreation sites and Federal economic generators.
 - Preserving existing access to Federal Lands and restoring serviceability of the assets.
 - Proposals where important access will be lost
 - In general, investment levels should be proportional to the % of use that is directly related to Federal Lands.

Proposal Selection Process

1) Request for Proposals issued

2) Local agencies partner with FLMA to submit Proposals

3) TAG evaluates proposals

6) After field reviews and info gathering, priority list is refined & recommendations finalized

5) Check in with PDC on initial prioritization and field reviews approved

 Proposals are prioritized, field reviews identified 7) Programming
Decisions Committee
(PDC) makes
decisions

8) Project is added to the program of projects.

Proposal Selection Process (con't)

- PDC will make final decision also considering:
 - Agency priorities
 - Applicant's share of the costs, previous federal investment specifically related to project, availability of funds, leverage of funds
 - Project delivery schedules
 - Environmental and right-of-way constraints
- Access Program contingent on available funding and authorizing legislation.

Match Requirement

- Statute (23 USC 120); Fed-Aid Rules
- Varies by State ID is 7.34%
 - OR is 10.27%
 - WA is 13.5%
- Match can be:
 - Cash (Non-Federal see below)
 - Services (labor), ROW, materials (rock, culvert, etc), equipment after agreement is signed

Match Requirement (con't)

Limitations:

- Non-Federal Funds unless specific statutory authority otherwise. Exceptions include:
 - ➤ Federal Lands Transportation Program/Tribal Transportation Funds
 - ➤ Federal Land Management Agency funds (Non Title 23/49)
- FLAP funds cannot be used as non-Federal match for other programs.

Upcoming 2018 OR & WA FLAP Request for Proposals

- RFP will be announced late Fall 2017 and proposals will be due early spring 2018
- Proposals must be submitted <u>jointly</u> by State, county, town, tribal, municipal or local government and the Federal Land Management Agency(ies) being accessed.

Types of Projects

Capital Improvement

- Rehabilitation, restoration, construction, & reconstruction of roads & trails
- Safety improvements, widening, realignments, surfacing, culverts, bridges, signing & associated road appurtenances

Enhancement

- Road and trail improvements
- Interpretive signs, kiosks, viewpoints, restrooms, provisions for pedestrians and bicycles, scenic easements, trailheads, and improvements that reduce vehiclewildlife conflicts

Transit

- Construction of transit facilities (passenger waiting shelters, ferry docks, helipads, etc.)
- Short term
 Operation & maintenance of transit facilities, including vehicles
- Purchase of transit vehicles

Planning

 Engineering studies, corridor management planning, bicycle and pedestrian planning, and alternative transportation system planning


